## Dear

I am writing in response to your emails dated 16<sup>th</sup> June and 18<sup>th</sup> June 2020 requesting information under the Freedom of Information Act (2000) regarding <u>amended/clarified</u> response for antibody tests and BAME deaths

On our acknowledgment we added the following statement:

The University Hospitals of North Midlands Trust is committed to the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

However, the NHS is facing unprecedented challenges relating to the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic at the current time. Understandably, our resources have been diverted to support our front-line colleagues who are working tremendously hard to provide care for our patients, and to those in need of our services.

We strive to be transparent and to work with an open culture. But at this time, whilst care of our patients and the safety of our staff takes precedent, it is likely that responses to some requests for information will be delayed. We apologise for this position in advance, and will endeayour to provide you with as much information as we can, as soon as we are able.

The Information Commissioners Office has recognised the current situation in the NHS.

On 18<sup>th</sup> June 2020 we contacted you via email to inform you that under section 12 of the FOI Act we would be aggregating your two requests; (former reference for request #1 = 089-2021)

The section 12 exemption states:

The authority can combine related requests received within a period of 60 consecutive days from:

- The same person or
- People who appear to be acting in concert or in pursuance of a campaign

On 16<sup>th</sup> June we contacted you via email as we required a time frame in order to collate the information. (Request #1)

As of 24<sup>th</sup> June our request for clarification for request number 1 has not been responded to, therefore in order to not delay request number 2 we are unable to proceed with request number 1

On 24<sup>th</sup> June 2020 in response to our finalising your request you replied via email with the following: "Hello







I didn't get a message seeking clarification?"

We forwarded you the email asking for clarification.

You replied via email with: "Thank you, the answer is "to date"."

As of 1<sup>st</sup> November 2014 University Hospitals of North Midlands NHS Trust (UHNM) manages two hospital sites – Royal Stoke University Hospital, and County Hospital (Stafford). Therefore the response below is for the two sites combined from that date where appropriate.

## Request #1

Q1 I am writing to you under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 to request the following information:

Of the Covid-19 antibody tests conducted to date among staff at your Trust, please provide information on:

- The proportion of staff that are antibody positive
- The proportion of BAME staff that are antibody positive
- A1 As per the above clarification.
  - a. The proportion of staff that are antibody positive = 13%
  - b. The Trust did not take ethnicity as part of antibody testing. In order to find out who has tested positive, as BAME staff, we would need to match swab test results to staff on ESR (Electronic Staff Register). Therefore the Trust considers the above request for information exempt under Section 12 (1) of the Freedom of Information Act (2000) this is because the information requested in your questions is not held centrally, but may be recorded in individual records. In order to confirm whether this information is held we would therefore have to individually access all individual staff records within the Trust and extract the information where it is present. We therefore estimate that complying with your request is exempt under section 12 of the FOI Act: cost of compliance is excessive. The section 12 exemption applies when it is estimated a request will take in excess of 18 hours to complete. We estimate that accessing and reviewing all individual staff records and then extracting relevant information would take longer than the 18 hours allowed for.

In addition to the section 12 exemption the Trust is also applying section 14 (1) exemption: oppressive burden on the authority

Under section 16 of the FOI Act we are required to provide requestors with advice and assistance where possible. We would therefore like to advise you that NHSIE may hold some information; they can be contacted at the following email address: england.contactus@nhs.net

## Request #2







Q1 I am writing to you under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 to request the following information:

How many members of staff (full-time and part-time) directly employed by your Trust have died after testing positive for Covid-19?

We are unable to provide the information you require in the requested format as to release this data could lead to the identification of the person(s) involved due to the low numbers involved, and would breach the Trusts obligations under Data Protection Act 2018. Accordingly, this aspect of your request is exempt from disclosure under the terms of Section 40(2) of the FOI Act. *Personal information*.

This exemption is an absolute exemption and therefore no consideration of the public interest test is needed

- Q2 How many BAME staff (full-time and part-time) directly employed by your Trust have died after testing positive for Covid-19?
- A2 None
- Q3 Where possible, please provide details of:
  - 3a. Age
  - 3b. Gender
  - 3c. Occupation
  - 3d. Nationality of staff members who have died after testing positive for Covid-

In order to protect patient confidentially this could be presented in such a format: For example:

- Occupation:
- Doctor 1
- Nurse 7
- Etc
- Gender:
- Male 3
- Female 5
- etc
