I am writing in response to your email dated 5th October 2020 (received into our office 6th October) requesting information under the Freedom of Information Act (2000) regarding data security.

On 6th October 2020 we contacted you via email as we required clarification on which NHS Trust you wanted information for as of 31st October 2014 University Hospital of North Staffordshire NHS Trust (UHNS) ceased to exist. As of 1st November 2014 Royal Stoke University Hospital and County Hospital (Stafford) became known as University Hospitals of North Midlands NHS Trust (UHNM)

On the same day you replied via email with the following:

"My apologies, I must update my records. Please can you provide the information requested for University Hospitals of North Midlands NHS Trust instead?"

As of 1st November 2014 University Hospitals of North Midlands NHS Trust (UHNM) manages two hospital sites – Royal Stoke University Hospital, and County Hospital (Stafford). Therefore the response below is for the two sites combined from that date where appropriate.

Q1 Under the Freedom of Information Act, I would like to ask for information University Hospital of North Staffordshire NHS Trust's data security spending & training on behalf of Redscan Ltd.

Please could you share the following information in the format of an CSV, XLS, XLXF file - or any other format that may be opened via Excel or Google Spread sheets. If you wish to add more context or information, please do so in a separate document or in the body of an email.

The Trust determines that to disclose this information would prejudice the Trust's ability to prevent and react to any cyber-attack. Cyber-attacks present a real risk of harm to members of staff and patients. The Trust has completed the public interest test and this has to been upheld.
