## Dear

I am writing in response to your email dated 26<sup>th</sup> September 2019 requesting information under the Freedom of Information Act (2000) regarding GCloud in the Public Sector.

As of 1<sup>st</sup> November 2014 University Hospitals of North Midlands NHS Trust (UHNM) manages two hospital sites – Royal Stoke University Hospital, and County Hospital (Stafford). Therefore the response below is for the two sites combined from that date where appropriate.

Q1 I hope you can help me with an exercise we are conducting, to understand more about the Procurement Strategies and the take up of GCloud in the Public Sector.

The information you provide as part of this Freedom of Information exercise will help us to understand the most appropriate way of interacting with Local Authorities in their buying cycles.

Is your current IT Service Management function and associated software application based in house or Outsourced to a 3rd Party?

- A1 IT Service Management Function is in house; the software is supplied by a 3<sup>rd</sup> party
- Q2 Please provide the full name and version of the ITSM software application in use?
- A2 Sunrise v5.1.0 -b519
- Q3 What is the lifetime value of the contract and over how many years?
- A3 The purchase order value is £13,557 this covers a 12 month period. The contact is from April 2019 to March 2020
- As part of the existing contract how many support operatives (agents) are licenced/subscribed to use the solution? (These are individuals who work on the desk in resolver groups, not customers using a Self-Service function).
- A4 71 users
- Q5 When is the contract due for renewal?
- A5 April 2020







- Q6 How was the current solution procured directly with the Vendor, through a Framework or via G Cloud?
- A6 Framework
- Q7 What are your published procurement thresholds for tendering purposes?
- A7 Please see below:

Under £20k: Informal quotation process required (3 quotes) £20k to £50k: A formal quotation process is required to be undertaken

- 1) For expenditure between £20,000 and £24,999 formal written quotes must be obtained.
- 2) For expenditure between £25,000 and £50,000 formal written quotes must be obtained and the requirement must be advertised through "Contracts Finder" or equivalent. £50k to £118,133 (OJEU threshold Supplies & Services) or £4,551,413 (OJEU threshold Works) Formal competitive tenders must be obtained and the requirement must be advertised through "contracts finder" or equivalent.

Over £118,133 (OJEU threshold Supplies & Services) or £4,551,413 (OJEU threshold Works) An advert is to be placed in OJEU (Office Journal of the European Union) and the requirement must be advertised through "contracts finder" or equivalent.

Competition need not be sought where the product/service is available via NHS Supply Chain/SCCL or NHS Frameworks such as Crown Commercial Services (CCS) collaborative procurement partner offerings, as these have already been subject to OJEU procurement processes, however the rules/requirements for accessing these type of agreements must be observed.

In ensuring that there is an appropriate level of competition on all Trust Procurements the Associate Director - Procurement and Commercial Services also has the responsibility of reporting instances where due procurement process has not been followed to the Chair of Audit Committee.

Reasonable consideration must be given to instances where, any single tender action is appropriate, and this with careful consideration to overall value for money versus operational need/risk to the organisation.

NB: for the avoidance of doubt though any expenditure/contract value over the minimum OJEU threshold (as outlined above) cannot be single tender waivered under EU Legislation.

- Q8 What is the Authority's strategy with regards to Cloud solutions as opposed to In House installations?
- At UHNM there is currently no formal decision to use cloud services
- Q9 Has the organisation ever procured through the G Cloud Framework?
- A9 Yes
