I am writing to acknowledge receipt of your email dated 20th October 2021 (received into our office 21st October) requesting information under the Freedom of Information Act (2000) regarding Maternity services.

As of 1st November 2014 University Hospitals of North Midlands NHS Trust (UHNM) manages two hospital sites – Royal Stoke University Hospital, and County Hospital (Stafford). Therefore the response below is for the two sites combined from that date where appropriate.

A1 We are unable to provide the information you require in the requested format as to release this data could lead to the identification of the person(s) involved due to the low numbers involved, and would breach the Trusts obligations under Data Protection Act 2018. Accordingly, this aspect of your request is exempt from disclosure under the terms of Section 40(2) of the FOI Act. *Personal information*.  - <5
- 2. How many midwife-led-unit births transferred into an obstetrician-led environment?
 - There were 14 transfers from FMBU at County (the intrapartum service was suspended there shortly after corvid commenced approx. April 2020)
 - The transfers from MBC for that year was 47







- 3. How many stillbirths were there in total across the Trust?
- 22 Ante / intra partum still births >= 24weeks gestation
- 4. How many of the caesarean sections results in a major haemorrhage?
- 1332 Deliveries had PPH >= 500ml
