I am writing to acknowledge receipt of your email's dated 4th June 2021 and 17<sup>th</sup> June 2021 requesting information under the Freedom of Information Act (2000) regarding trial; this is an additional question therefore a new request

## The University Hospitals of North Midlands Trust is committed to the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

However, the NHS is facing unprecedented challenges relating to the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic at the current time. Understandably, our resources have been diverted to support our front-line colleagues who are working tremendously hard to provide care for our patients, and to those in need of our services.

We strive to be transparent and to work with an open culture. But at this time, whilst care of our patients and the safety of our staff takes precedent, it is likely that responses to some requests for information will be delayed. We apologise for this position in advance, and will endeavour to provide you with as much information as we can, as soon as we are able.

## The Information Commissioners Office has recognised the current situation in the NHS

On 17<sup>th</sup> June 2021 you emailed an additional question, you stated:

'I would like to alert you to some information I have recently obtained from the HRA concerning application for ethics approval for the IMPROvED trial. I have attached the application here. In this application, as the Chief Investigator, is claiming to be the Clinical Director for Obstetrics and Gynaecology at the University Hospital of North Staffordshire (please see p4/31). Even though the name is redacted, it is clear that a shares in Diagnostic Metabolomics. I don't think ----

could have been the Clinical Director for Obstetrics and Gynaecology because he did not have a licence to practise and was working full-time in New Zealand. I appreciate that UHNM might not have been aware of this apparently fraudulent application for ethics approval because the sponsor was Keele University.

Would UHNM care to comment on this? Am I correct in assuming that was not the Director for Obstetrics and Gynaecology at your hospital?'

As of 1<sup>st</sup> November 2014 University Hospitals of North Midlands NHS Trust (UHNM) manages two hospital sites – Royal Stoke University Hospital, and County Hospital (Stafford). Therefore the response below is for the two sites combined from that date where appropriate.







Q1 Many thanks indeed for your helpful response (FOI ref 086-2122). I would be most grateful if you could answer a final question concerning the STRIDER trial:

What was the date that the sponsor of the STRIDER trial submitted an amendment to replace as the Principal Investigator?

- A1 Amendment submitted 03 March 2015 (FOI 086-2122).
- Q2 You further wrote on 17<sup>th</sup> June 2021 seeking clarification on whether or not was employed as Director for Obstetrics and Gynaecology at your hospital at UHNM. Our response to that question is below.
- A2 We can confirm that has never been an employee of UHNM.
