I am writing in response to your email dated 10th January 2020 regarding our release of information under the Freedom of Information Act (2000) for prescribing data for CBPMs

You emailed the following:

"Many thanks for your email. I am writing to request clarification on your response that the Trust "does not use any of the above drugs; therefore this request is not applicable" Please could you explain whether there is a Trust policy to not use or fund these drugs or whether that there have simply been no prescriptions issued in the time period?

The Trust provides specialist neurological services for multiple sclerosis and epilepsy and specialist oncological services. There are now cannabis-based drugs that are licensed and recommended by NICE for use in indications relevant to these specialist services, if the patient has not adequately responded to other treatments (Sativex for moderate-to-severe spasticity in MS, Epidiolex for reducing seizures in Dravet syndrome and Lennox Gastaut syndrome and Nabilone for chemotherapy-induced nausea and vomiting). If an authorised prescriber in the Trust believed that it was in a patient's best interests to offer one of these medicines, would they be able to?

Any further information you can provide would be very gratefully received!"

As of 1st November 2014 University Hospitals of North Midlands NHS Trust (UHNM) manages two hospital sites – Royal Stoke University Hospital, and County Hospital (Stafford). Therefore the response below is for the two sites combined from that date where appropriate.

- Q1 Where data is available, please send me:
 - 1. The number of prescriptions issued within the Trust, per month, for the period November 2018 September 2019, for the following items:
 - a. Sativex
 - b. Nabilone
 - c. Epidiolex/Epydiolex
 - d. Unlicensed cannabis-based products for medicinal use (CBPMs).
- A1 UHNM does not use any of the above drugs; therefore this request is not applicable

<u>Our clarification</u>: There is no Trust policy in place that prohibits the use of the aforementioned medications. No prescriptions have been received into Pharmacy at the point of response.







- Q2 Total costs to the Trust associated with prescriptions of unlicensed cannabis-based products for medicinal use over the same time period.
- A2 As answer 1

<u>Our clarification:</u> After completion of the necessary implementation period, an authorised prescriber within UHNM would, if believed to be within the patient's best interest, be able to provide access to cannabinoid products in line with the clinical commissioning criteria. Where by UHNM does not meet the specialist criteria, this would be by means of onwards referral to the relevant centre.

UHNM NHS Trust is a public sector body and governed by EU law. FOI requestors should note that any new Trust requirements over the EU threshold will be subject to these regulations and will be advertised for open competition accordingly.
