I am writing in response to your email dated 6th February 2020 requesting information under the Freedom of Information Act (2000) regarding data sharing and data skills.

On 7th February 2020 we contacted you via email as we required proof of identity, The FOI Act clearly states that if we suspect that the request has come from a Pseudonym we are entitled to request proof of the person's identity, as provision of a Pseudonym invalidates a request. Please note:

UHNM's request for identification is in compliance with the Information Commissioner guidance "Recognising a request made under the Freedom of Information Act (section 8) Version 1.2". On the same day you replied via email with the appropriate proof of identity.

As of 1st November 2014 University Hospitals of North Midlands NHS Trust (UHNM) manages two hospital sites – Royal Stoke University Hospital, and County Hospital (Stafford). Therefore the response below is for the two sites combined from that date where appropriate.

- Q1 For the following questions, I understand data analytics technology to mean software that aggregates and analyses data to identify patterns and deliver insights.
 - Is your hospital part of a multi-agency integrated network that shares data for `analysis? If so, please confirm with which agencies you share data (i.e. police, social services, fire services, etc.)
