I am writing to acknowledge receipt of your email dated 06.05.21 requesting information under the Freedom of Information Act (2000) regarding Maternity Training.

## The University Hospitals of North Midlands Trust is committed to the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

However, the NHS is facing unprecedented challenges relating to the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic at the current time. Understandably, our resources have been diverted to support our front-line colleagues who are working tremendously hard to provide care for our patients, and to those in need of our services.

We strive to be transparent and to work with an open culture. But at this time, whilst care of our patients and the safety of our staff takes precedent, it is likely that responses to some requests for information will be delayed. We apologise for this position in advance, and will endeavour to provide you with as much information as we can, as soon as we are able.

The Information Commissioners Office has recognised the current situation in the NHS

As of 1<sup>st</sup> November 2014 University Hospitals of North Midlands NHS Trust (UHNM) manages two hospital sites – Royal Stoke University Hospital, and County Hospital (Stafford). Therefore the response below is for the two sites combined from that date where appropriate.

## Q1 We write to request information from your Trust pursuant to the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

The Request

Baby Lifeline is a charity supporting the safe care of pregnant women and newborn babies all over the UK. Training in maternity remains a central recommendation in reports reviewing avoidable harm. The objective of this FOI is to provide an overall picture of maternity training in relation to recommendations of best practice to improve care, determine barriers, and ultimately save babies' and mothers' lives. Baby Lifeline's research in this area is the only work which surveys maternity training provided to the frontline nationally.

The last report utilised 140 responses from organisations providing maternity services (89%), and has been used to inform government health policy, been cited in the Houses of Parliament, and the latest recommendations have led to quality improvement work being carried out by the Maternity Transformation Programme nationally.







We are sending this letter to obtain information about training programmes offered and supported. Please be aware that any data produced will always be anonymised. We will be publishing a list of those trusts included and not included, but no data will be identifiable.
