I am writing in response to your email dated 4th October 2019 requesting information under the Freedom of Information Act (2000) regarding Da Vinci robot.

As of 1st November 2014 University Hospitals of North Midlands NHS Trust (UHNM) manages two hospital sites – Royal Stoke University Hospital, and County Hospital (Stafford). Therefore the response below is for the two sites combined from that date where appropriate.

Q1 I am writing to you to kindly request information under the Freedom of Information Act.

It is now known that there is a substantial increase in the number of trusts within the English NHS that have implemented the Da Vinci robot. This has resulted in substitution effects across technologies within the prostatectomy specialty: firstly, laparoscopic procedures to replace open; secondly, robotic procedures to replace laparoscopic. We aim to address how this substitution has impacted diffusion to other surgical specialties, patient outcomes and labour productivity.

Questions for your Trust (in order of importance):

- 1. Does your Trust have a Da Vinci robot? If yes, please provide:
