# **UHNM** answer below:

Neurology patients at University Hospital of North Midlands (UHNM) are referred into a General Neurology Service.

Once a patient has been seen by a Neurology Consultant and a diagnosis of either Multiple Sclerosis (MS), Parkinson's Disease (PD), Epilepsy or Motor Neuron Disease (MND). Patients can then be either followed up by the consultant alone and/or can be seen by a Clinical Nurse Specialists (CNS) for on-going care in line with their management plan within the sub-speciality areas.

UHNM do not hold General Neurology Clinics under the headings of Progressive Supraneuclear Palsy (PSP), Multiply System Atrophy (MSA) or Corticobasal Degeneration/Syndrome (CBD).

UHNM do not hold information as to whether the patient is a PSP, MSA or CBC.

# **General Neurology Clinic**

During July 18 to March 19 UHNM saw 28,837 General Neurology Patients (New and Follow Up) During March 19 to July 19 UHNM saw 14,060 General Neurology Patients (New and Follow up).

#### **Movement Disorder Clinic**

 69 patients of the above total amount are seen in UHNM's once a month Movement Disorder Clinic.

#### **Other**

 All other Movement Disorder patients are seen under the care of the Midlands Partnership Foundation Trust (MPFT). A Service Line Agreement (SLA) between UHNM and MPFT is in place for a UHNM consultant to deliver a movement disorder clinic at Haywood Hospital, Stoke on Trent.

Any PD, MS or MND rehabilitation will also be held at MPFT for patients.
