I am writing to acknowledge receipt of your email dated 3rd February 2022 requesting information under the Freedom of Information Act (2000) regarding number of beds.

The University Hospitals of North Midlands Trust is committed to the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

However, the NHS is facing unprecedented challenges relating to the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic at the current time. Understandably, our resources have been diverted to support our front-line colleagues who are working tremendously hard to provide care for our patients, and to those in need of our services.

We strive to be transparent and to work with an open culture. But at this time, whilst care of our patients and the safety of our staff takes precedent, it is likely that responses to some requests for information will be delayed. We apologise for this position in advance, and will endeavour to provide you with as much information as we can, as soon as we are able.

The Information Commissioners Office has recognised the current situation in the NHS.

As of 1st November 2014 University Hospitals of North Midlands NHS Trust (UHNM) manages two hospital sites – Royal Stoke University Hospital, and County Hospital (Stafford). Therefore the response below is for the two sites combined from that date where appropriate.

Q1 Stated separately for December 15, 2019, and December 15, 2021:

How many patient hospital beds did the Trust have on its premises? This should be a total of all patient hospital beds, including those used as day beds and overnight beds.

Q2 How many patient hospital beds did the Trust have open?







A2 There is no national requirement for Trusts to hold historical information on how many beds a trust had open, however each Trust does submit a daily SITREP return to NHS England which has some limited information about beds.

Open the report, go to the tabs relating to G&A bed and look for either the code RJE or Name University Hospitals of North Midlands NHS Trust to obtain the information we have submitted.

Q3 How many patient hospital beds did the Trust have closed?

A3 There is no national requirement for Trusts to hold historical information on how many beds a trust had closed, however each trust does submit a daily SITREP return to NHS England which has some limited information about bed closures due to D&V and norovirus.
