I am writing in response to your email dated 16th December 2019 requesting information under the Freedom of Information Act (2000) regarding recruitment campaigns overseas.

As of 1st November 2014 University Hospitals of North Midlands NHS Trust (UHNM) manages two hospital sites – Royal Stoke University Hospital, and County Hospital (Stafford). Therefore the response below is for the two sites combined from that date where appropriate.

Q1 Please tell me for the last three financial years (2016/17, 2017/18 and 2018/19) how many staff recruitment campaigns have been run outside the UK.

Please tell me:

- a) In which country each campaign was focused
- b) The recruitment agency commissioned to carry out the campaign

c) The amount of money spent on all recruitment campaigns over the three financial years (i.e. aggregated so it is not commercially sensitive)

d) The number of staff obtained through each campaign and the positions which they filled

e) At the WHO's 63rd World Health Assembly, The 'Global Code of Practice on the International Recruitment of Health Personnel' proposed "conditions for the recruitment of health personnel should be set out in bilateral agreements between source and destination countries, thereby creating win-win situations in the context of health workforce migration. These bilateral agreements could, for instance, foresee a reimbursement of the source country for every migrating doctor." https://www.ncbi.nlm.nih.gov/pmc/articles/PMC3926986/

Can you please tell me whether/how your Trust ensured it followed this global code of good practice in its recruitment efforts of foreign healthcare workers?
