Dear Madam(s)

I am writing in response to your emails dated 2nd June 2020 requesting information under the Freedom of Information Act (2000) regarding cannula removal and sharp containers

On our acknowledgment we added the following statement: The University Hospitals of North Midlands Trust is committed to the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

However, the NHS is facing unprecedented challenges relating to the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic at the current time. Understandably, our resources have been diverted to support our front-line colleagues who are working tremendously hard to provide care for our patients, and to those in need of our services.

We strive to be transparent and to work with an open culture. But at this time, whilst care of our patients and the safety of our staff takes precedent, it is likely that responses to some requests for information will be delayed. We apologise for this position in advance, and will endeavour to provide you with as much information as we can, as soon as we are able.

The Information Commissioners Office has recognised the current situation in the NHS.

On the same we contacted you both to inform you that under section 12 of the FOI Act we would be aggregating your two requests;

The section 12 exemption states:

The authority can combine related requests received within a period of 60 consecutive days from:

- The same person or
- People who appear to be acting in concert or in pursuance of a campaign.

As of 1st November 2014 University Hospitals of North Midlands NHS Trust (UHNM) manages two hospital sites – Royal Stoke University Hospital, and County Hospital (Stafford). Therefore the response below is for the two sites combined from that date where appropriate.

Request #1- On 2nd June 2020 we contacted you as we required the following clarification:







- Q2 Please clarify if you are wanting information for number of patients who have been admitted to hospital who have had been diagnosed during their stay as having a catheter related bloodstream infection?
- Q3 Are you wanting the number of patients who have been admitted to hospital who have had been diagnosed during their stay as having phlebitis?

As of 16th June 2020 our request for clarification for request number 1 has not been responded to , therefore in order to not delay request number 2 we are unable to proceed with request number 1.

Request #1

- Q1 What were the recorded reasons for the removal of IV peripheral cannulas within your hospital Trust within the last 10 years? Please provide annual numbers for each reason for removal.
- A1 UHNM is unable to answer the above as our request for clarification (02/06/2020) has been unanswered, therefore this request is closed. We will re-open if the applicant contacts us again with the clarification requested above.
- Q2 What is the annual number of catheter related bloodstream infections within your hospital Trust within the last 10 years?
- A2 As answer 1
- Q3 What are the annual recorded incidents of phlebitis within your hospital Trust in the last 10
- A3 As answer 1

Request #2

Q1 I have been doing some research and require more information and I was wondering if you could provide further information under the Freedom of Information Act:

Please could you provide all recorded figures for the following questions:

How many sharps containers were disposed of annually for your NHS Hospital Trust within the last 10 years?

- A1 Prior to 2019/20 financial year, no data can be drawn upon due to the changing contractors however the total number of sharps containers used on site in 2019/20 financial year is 53,260
- Q2 What is the annual recorded cost for sharps container disposal for your NHS Hospital Trust within the last 10 years?







A2 Data cannot be split into individual spend on sharps as the Trust tracks the volume of waste categories opposed to the containers it has been disposed in.

*Please note that any individuals identified do not give consent for their personal data to be processed for the purposes of direct marketing.

UHNM NHS Trust is a public sector body and governed by EU law. FOI requestors should note that any new Trust requirements over the EU threshold will be subject to these regulations and will be advertised for open competition accordingly.
