I am writing in response to your email dated 3<sup>rd</sup> February 2020 requesting information under the Freedom of Information Act (2000) regarding iron infusions and patient product breakdown.

I can neither confirm nor deny whether the information you have requested is held by the Trust in its entirety. This is because the information requested in questions 3 and 4 is not held centrally, but may be recorded in individual health records. In order to confirm whether this information is held we would therefore have to individually access all individual health records within the Trust and extract the information where it is present. We therefore estimate that complying with your request is exempt under section 12 of the FOI Act: *cost of compliance is excessive*. The section 12 exemption applies when it is estimated a request will take in excess of 18 hours to complete. We estimate that accessing and reviewing all individual health records and then extracting relevant information would take longer than the 18 hours allowed for.

In addition to the section 12 exemption the Trust is also applying section 14 (1) exemption: *oppressive burden on the authority* 

Under section 16 of the FOI Act we are required to provide requestors with advice and assistance where possible. We would therefore like to advise you that if your request is shortened to just the questions that we are able to comply within the 18 hour time frame. In order to avoid delay to your response we have provided this below.

On the same day we contacted you via email as we required a specific timeframe in order to collate the information.

On 3<sup>rd</sup> March 2020 you replied via email with the following: "Please can the time frame be for the latest 12 months available (Jan19 - Dec19)"

As of 1<sup>st</sup> November 2014 University Hospitals of North Midlands NHS Trust (UHNM) manages two hospital sites – Royal Stoke University Hospital, and County Hospital (Stafford). Therefore the response below is for the two sites combined from that date where appropriate.

## Q1 How many patients have received an iron infusion in the last 12 months?

- A1 885 Patients
- Q2 How many patients have been treated with Monofer and how many with Ferinject?
- A2 714 Patients







### Q3 What was the average weight of these patients?

- A3 Section 12 and 14 exemptions as detailed above
- Q4 How many patients required more than 1 gram of iron?
- A4 As answer 3

#### Q5 How many nurses and for what days and hours are your Iron infusion clinics available?

A5 Clinics they would run Monday- Friday 09:00-17:00 These will not be solely for iron and will be doing other procedures also depending on the patient/needs/pathway etc., one nurse per clinic (they would have more in the clinic but one nurse allocated to the patient and only X amount of infusions in one day due to the nature of them)
