I am writing in response to your email dated 11th June 2020 requesting information under the Freedom of Information Act (2000) regarding Covid discharges

On our acknowledgment we added the following statement:

The University Hospitals of North Midlands Trust is committed to the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

However, the NHS is facing unprecedented challenges relating to the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic at the current time. Understandably, our resources have been diverted to support our front-line colleagues who are working tremendously hard to provide care for our patients, and to those in need of our services.

We strive to be transparent and to work with an open culture. But at this time, whilst care of our patients and the safety of our staff takes precedent, it is likely that responses to some requests for information will be delayed. We apologise for this position in advance, and will endeavour to provide you with as much information as we can, as soon as we are able.

The Information Commissioners Office has recognised the current situation in the NHS.

I can neither confirm nor deny whether the information you have requested is held by the Trust in its entirety. This is because the information requested in question 4 is not held centrally, but may be recorded in individual health records. In order to confirm whether this information is held we would therefore have to individually access all individual health records within the Trust and extract the information where it is present. We therefore estimate that complying with your request is exempt under section 12 of the FOI Act: *cost of compliance is excessive*. The section 12 exemption applies when it is estimated a request will take in excess of 18 hours to complete. We estimate that accessing and reviewing all individual health records and then extracting relevant information would take longer than the 18 hours allowed for.

In addition to the section 12 exemption the Trust is also applying section 14 (1) exemption: *oppressive* burden on the authority

Under section 16 of the FOI Act we are required to provide requestors with advice and assistance where possible. We would therefore like to advise you that if your request is shortened to just the questions that we are able to comply within the 18 hour time frame. In order to avoid delay to your response we have provided this below.







As of 1st November 2014 University Hospitals of North Midlands NHS Trust (UHNM) manages two hospital sites – Royal Stoke University Hospital, and County Hospital (Stafford). Therefore the response below is for the two sites combined from that date where appropriate.

Q1 I am sending this request under the Freedom of Information Act.

This is a request concerning the number of patients with Covid-19 who were discharged to care homes from your hospital wards.

- 1) Please could you state how many patients were discharged to care homes after a positive Covid-19 test between March 17th and April 16th 2020?
- A1 Total positive discharges = 21

Please note that routine testing prior to discharge to care homes was introduced by Government and Public Health England on 15 April 2020

- Q2 Please could you state how many patients were discharged to care homes without being tested for Covid-19 between March 17th and April 16th 2020
- A2 Zero
- Q3 Please could you state how many patients were discharged to care homes with a negative test for Covid-19 between March 17th and April 16th 2020?
- A3 97
- Q4 Please state whether you have reviewed any of these discharges between March 17th and April 16th to check if they led to any further transmission of Covid-19.

If so, please state the number that was recorded as leading to further transmission.

- A4 Section 12 and 14 exemptions as detailed above
- Q5 Please provide a copy of any reports in which the Trust's discharge of patients to care homes during the March 17th to April 16th 2020 is analysed in relation to the Covid-19 pandemic
- A5 Discharge summaries are recorded and held on the Trust PAS system for every patient. Business Intelligence reports are also stored in the Trust data warehouse and used for analytical purposes. As these all contain patient identifiable information they would not be shared externally.

UHNM NHS Trust is a public sector body and governed by EU law. FOI requestors should note that any new Trust requirements over the EU threshold will be subject to these regulations and will be advertised for open competition accordingly.
