I am writing to acknowledge receipt of your email dated 25th January 2022 requesting information under the Freedom of Information Act (2000) regarding on another query on our response for Guillain Barre Syndrome.

You stated:

'Thank you again for your response regarding clarification of my FOI request. I just wanted to check these matters to see if I have absolutely understood the trust position and whether the trust has absolutely understood my FOI.

In your response you use the word definitely in italics "definitely caused by the vaccine." My FOI request was "associated with." This is a temporal matter. Was the patient vaccinated within the previous 4-6 weeks with AZ. If you have data that fits that criteria, then I would be grateful, if you would provide it.

If not, just to be absolutely clear. There is no systematic way or protocol for accurately and rigorously recording adverse effects in hospital due to Covid-19 vaccination. There is no knowledge of the patients vaccination status because it is held only by GP.

There was also no specific protocol provided to NHS trusts for the accurate recording and collation of adverse effects from Covid-19 vaccination - just the yellow card scheme.

I note too this article in Nottingham - so it was just a chance occurrence that they picked up on it?
