I am writing in response to your email dated 24th March 2021 requesting information under the Freedom of Information Act (2000) regarding Covid-19

The University Hospitals of North Midlands Trust is committed to the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

However, the NHS is facing unprecedented challenges relating to the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic at the current time. Understandably, our resources have been diverted to support our front-line colleagues who are working tremendously hard to provide care for our patients, and to those in need of our services.

We strive to be transparent and to work with an open culture. But at this time, whilst care of our patients and the safety of our staff takes precedent, it is likely that responses to some requests for information will be delayed. We apologise for this position in advance, and will endeavour to provide you with as much information as we can, as soon as we are able.

The Information Commissioners Office has recognised the current situation in the NHS

On 24th March 2021 we contacted you via email as we required clarification on what you mean by diagnosed, do you actually mean diagnosed or tested positive for Covid-19?

On the same day you replied via email with: *"I mean 'tested positive'*

As of 1st November 2014 University Hospitals of North Midlands NHS Trust (UHNM) manages two hospital sites – Royal Stoke University Hospital, and County Hospital (Stafford). Therefore the response below is for the two sites combined from that date where appropriate.

- Q1 The number of instances where an inpatient at the Trust was diagnosed with covid-19, where the covid-19 diagnosis was made 15 days or more after admission (the common definition for 'definitely' nosocomial), in each month since and including March 2020.
- A1 I can confirm that the Trust holds information regarding covid-19, but feel this information is exempt under section 21: *information reasonably accessible by other means.* This is because UHNM has been answering Covid-19 related FOI requests since March 2020 all can be found via the Trust's public website at the following link:

- Q4 The number of deaths of patients of the Trust who had been diagnosed with covid-19, where the covid-19 diagnoses had been made between 8 and 15 days or more after hospital admission (the common definition for 'probable' nosocomial), in each month since and including March 2020. Please include instances only where the patient's death occurred while they were inpatients at the Trust.
- A4 As answer 1







- Q5 Any additional summary analysis/reports the Trust has carried out itself into the number of deaths of patients following a covid-19 infection which was likely or definite to be nosocomial.

- Q6 Please also provide, with suitable redactions, any serious incident reviews or corporate reviews into any of these deaths.

Under the act you have 20 working days to respond, giving a deadline of 14 April.
