I am writing in response to your email dated 24th February 2020 requesting information under the Freedom of Information Act (2000) regarding Haemonetics devices for plasma procedures.

On the same day we contacted you via email as we required clarification on the specific devise you were referring to.

You replied via email with the following:

"I'd like to know about any Haemonetics plasma device the Trust has used, but if you need specific model names then please can you tell me if you've used the PCS2 or MC+ models".

As of 1st November 2014 University Hospitals of North Midlands NHS Trust (UHNM) manages two hospital sites – Royal Stoke University Hospital, and County Hospital (Stafford). Therefore the response below is for the two sites combined from that date where appropriate.

- Q1 Please can you tell me if the Trust has used any Haemonetics devices for plasma procedures over the last 10 years and how many of these devices are currently in operation?
- As per your above clarification the Trust has already answered a request made by you regarding PCS2 therefore this information is exempt under section 21: *information reasonably accessible by other means*. - If there has been any type of malfunction with the device. Please provide details of the incident, the date it occurred and if the patient who was connected to the machine was affected in any way as a result of the malfunction
- Please can you tell me if the machine continued to be used after any of the malfunction incidents?
- How many of these incidents have been reported to the MHRA or another regulatory agency. For each incident reported please include all detail given to MHRA if possible
