I am writing to acknowledge receipt of your email dated 30th June 2021 requesting information under the Freedom of Information Act (2000) regarding Covid.

I can neither confirm nor deny whether the information you have requested is held by the Trust in its entirety. This is because the information requested in question 1 is not held centrally, but may be recorded in individual health records. In order to confirm whether this information is held we would therefore have to individually access all individual health records within the Trust and extract the information where it is present. We therefore estimate that complying with your request is exempt under section 12 of the FOI Act: cost of compliance is excessive. The section 12 exemption applies when it is estimated a request will take in excess of 18 hours to complete. We estimate that accessing and reviewing all individual health records and then extracting relevant information would take longer than the 18 hours allowed for. In addition to the section 12 exemption the Trust is also applying section 14 (1) exemption: oppressive burden on the authority

Under section 16 of the FOI Act we are required to provide requestors with advice and assistance where possible. We would therefore like to advise you that if your request is shortened to just question 2 we are able to comply within the 18 hour time frame. In order to avoid delay to your response we have provided this below.

On 6th July 2021 we contacted you via email as we required the following clarification: We require clarification on if you meant Hospital Acquired Covid19 Infections in Q2 (as referred to in Q1) or if you mean ALL hospital acquired infections in Q2

On 13th July 2021 you replied via email with the following: 'In Q2 I meant Hospital Acquired Covid-19 infections'.

As of 1st November 2014 University Hospitals of North Midlands NHS Trust (UHNM) manages two hospital sites – Royal Stoke University Hospital, and County Hospital (Stafford). Therefore the response below is for the two sites combined from that date where appropriate.

- Q1 Please can you tell me how many cases of hospital-acquired Covid-19 the Trust has had since 1st March 2020 to the present day? Please break this down by probable and definite nosocomial infections if this data is available.
- A1 Section 12 exemption as detailed above:







- Q2 Please also give me the number of deaths from hospital acquired infections (probable and definite cases). If you are able please state, in each case, if you have informed the patient's relative that it was a hospital acquired infection?
- A2 See below:

From 1st March 2020:

deceased patients who tested positive for Covid 19, 8 to 14 days from admission to positive test: 167 (probable)

deceased patients who tested positive for Covid19, 15 days+ from admission to positive test: 115 (definite

Information is not held on whether a patient's relative was informed if it was a hospital acquired infection
